Thanks to our generous donors, we raised over \$300,000 towards the cost of our expansion. 

CLIENT SATISFACTION



98% of our surveyed clients in 2017-2018 indicated that they would refer a friend in need of counseling to NFCC.

Our research shows

- Approximately 46% of adult clients at intake self-reported symptoms that met diagnostic criteria for clinical depression, clinical levels of anxiety, or both.
- Client satisfaction data collected to date indicates that 91% of those surveyed believe they were able to see a counselor as quickly as they'd hoped.

This suggests that NFCC has successfully removed at least some barriers to treatment.

WHAT MAKES NFCC UNIQUE?

Compared to other low cost counseling centers in the area, NFCC fills a unique space in the counseling ecosystem by offering sessions with licensed counselors in a private practice atmosphere for under \$100. By removing barriers associated with typical low cost clinics such as: difficulty scheduling appointments or receiving insurance approval, and having a low set fee, NFCC is likely able to provide services to individuals who would not otherwise engage in counseling. There are comparable centers in the area that can be appropriately considered for referral even if the client has financial constraints, but none can match the quality of the atmosphere or the administrative supports for the set price offered at NFCC.
