In addition to traditional on-site services, NFCC's ever-expanding outreach program is one of our most exciting endeavors. Our team of outreach counselors provide support groups and mental health education to students and parents. They also provide training for teachers and workplace wellness talks. With the help of our corporate partners, NFCC made a commitment to provide pro-bono outreach services to Title I schools in the greater Houston area. We also filled a need for oncampus groups. Our outreach team delivered five skills-based groups (Relational Aggression, Social Skills and Girls Self-Esteem) at YES Prep Southwest Secondary, YES Prep Hobby Secondary, and West University Methodist School.





COMMUNITIES IN SCHOOLS (CIS)

Through our CIS partnership, NFCC has provided free campus-based individual therapy to Houston area students, once a week, during the school year, for more than six years. NFCC counselors are currently placed at Milby High School, Ashford Elementary, and Westchester Academy.



PRACTICUM PROGRAM

NFCC is a training site for the next generation of mental health counselors. Our Clinical Director supervises graduate students from several universities, as they provide direct support to clients at NFCC and our off-site partners. Our 2024 off-site partners were St. Mark's Episcopal School and Tony's Place (Salvation Army). NFCC's practicum counselors also have the opportunity to observe counseling sessions performed by NFCC counselors, to obtain the necessary hours needed for program completion.



SURVIVORS OF SUICIDE SUPPORT GROUP (SOS)

The need was great enough to host two cohorts of our Survivors of Suicide Loss Support Group, one in January and another in September. Led by Lizzy Bowen, LCSW, and David Lara, LPC-A, our SOS groups provide a lifeline to survivors who feel isolated and alone in their grief and loss; often compounded by the stigma and shame associated with suicide. This group gives participants a safe and healing space to build resiliency, community, and find support.


